The SfAA Podcast Project is a student-driven initiative that seeks to provide **free** audio recordings of selected sessions. These recordings have helped to make anthropology more accessible to those who can not travel to the conference & to non-anthropologists. Since its launch at the 2007 Annual Meeting, the SfAA Podcasts website has received over 42,000 visits from six of the seven major continents. Over 50 podcasts from the 2007-2010 Annual Meetings are available on our website now & the 2011 podcasts will become available in April 2011.

Frequently Asked Questions:

- **What is a “podcast?” What is a “blog post?”**
 - A podcast is essentially just an audio file. A blog post refers to the entries made on our website (SfAApodcasts.net).
- **Which sessions are being recorded & how were they selected?**
 - 17 sessions are being recorded in 2011; a complete list will be available on the website in April. They were selected based on their broad appeal and to represent a diversity of topics. Suggestions were solicited from several anthropology departments, the SfAA Board, our blog readers, & the SfAA Office. 50 sessions from 2007-2010 are available on our website now.
